COMM V. ENG HOCKEY GAME




The annual charity hockey game raised an astounding \$62,000 for the Canadian Cancer Society!

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5 DAYS FOR HOMELESSNESS CAMPAIGN

The Dalhousie Commerce Society has proudly championed the 5 Days for Homelessness campaign for over a decade, evolving its approach to deepen its impact on the local community. Initially focused on raising awareness and funds through a five-day outdoor sleepout, the initiative has transitioned to a more hands-on and year-round commitment in collaboration with Phoenix Youth Shelter, a vital organization in Halifax supporting at-risk youth. This year, we have embraced a new approach to the campaign, emphasizing sustained community engagement and direct action. Nearly every Wednesday throughout the fall and winter semesters, dedicated members of our society, our umbrella societies, and other societies at Dalhousie partner with us by volunteering two hours of their time to prepare meals for Phoenix Youth Shelter. This shift not only aligns with our values of empathy and action but also strengthens our connection to the individuals and communities we aim to support. Our weekly meal preparation sessions reflect the society's commitment to addressing youth homelessness in meaningful ways. This transition from traditional fundraising to ongoing volunteerism has allowed us to foster a deeper understanding of the realities faced by vulnerable youth in our city. The experience has been transformative for our members, teaching lessons in humility, teamwork, and the profound impact of even the smallest acts of kindness. As we look toward the future, the Dalhousie Commerce Society remains committed to growing the 5 Days for Homelessness campaign, inviting more students and community members to join our efforts.

Together, we can continue to make a tangible difference in the lives of those we serve, championing a vision of a Halifax where all young people have the resources and support they need to thrive!
